Nurse practitioner students must also meet the nurse practitioner core and the population-focused specific competencies established for their respective future area(s) of practice.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A bachelor's degree in nursing from a CCNE or ACEN regionally accredited institution with a "B" average or better OR
- The equivalent bachelors and/or graduate degrees in nursing from a foreign institution
- A current license as a Registered Nurse in the State of Florida
- Completed a 3-credit hour or equivalent in length undergraduate level statistics course with a grade of B or better
- A personal interview with designated faculty member may also be required

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Submit a USF Office of Admissions Application

2. Begin a College of Nursing Application via Nursing CAS

- The NursingCAS application is \$65, to be paid when the application is submitted.

Note: A U-number is required in order to submit the NursingCAS application. Individuals who have completed step 1 (applied to USF admissions) will receive an email from USF on how to access their U-number within 48 hours.

3. Upload all required supplemental materials to NursingCAS

- Three letters of recommendation
- Resume
- Personal statement
- Sealed official transcripts from all higher education institutions attended should be mailed directly from your college to:

4. Submit your NursingCAS application

- Once steps 1-3 have been completed, submit the application via NursingCAS.
- Contact NursingCAS to confirm that all official transcripts have been received.
- Application should be submitted at least 5 weeks prior to the deadline.

International Applicants:

All coursework and degrees completed outside the U.S. require an evaluation from an approved evaluating agency. Foreign transcript evaluation services approved by USF Office of Admissions can be found at USF Office of Admissions can be found at usf.edu/admissions/international/.
