- All MS-DNP students are required to complete the didactic and clinical experiences necessary for achievement of the competencies associated with doctoral education. You must fulfill the requirements associated with the DNP evidence-based practice project and the DNP residency.

- Master of Science with a major in Nursing from a regionally accredited college or university
- An overall 3.0 GPA
- Licensure as an advanced practice nurse (CRNA, NP, CNM, CNS) - Florida license needed for residencies
- National certification in area of advanced practice

3. Upload all required supplemental materials to NursingCAS

- Three letters of recommendation
- Resume
- Personal statement

4. Submit your NursingCAS application

- Once steps 1-3 have been completed, submit the application via NursingCAS.
- Contact NursingCAS to confirm that all official transcripts have been received.
- Application should be submitted at least 5 weeks prior to the deadline.

International Applicants:

All coursework and degrees completed outside the U.S. require an evaluation from an approved evaluating agency. Foreign transcript evaluation services approved by USF Office of Admissions can be found at usf.edu/ admissions/international/.
